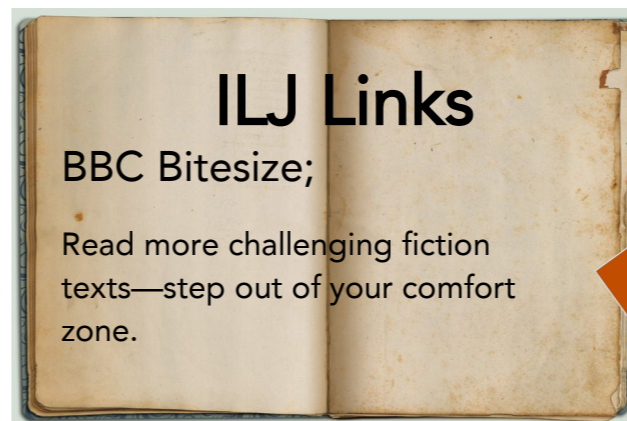




Year 9 Spring Term 2 – Knowledge Organiser 'Analysis of Unseen Prose'
