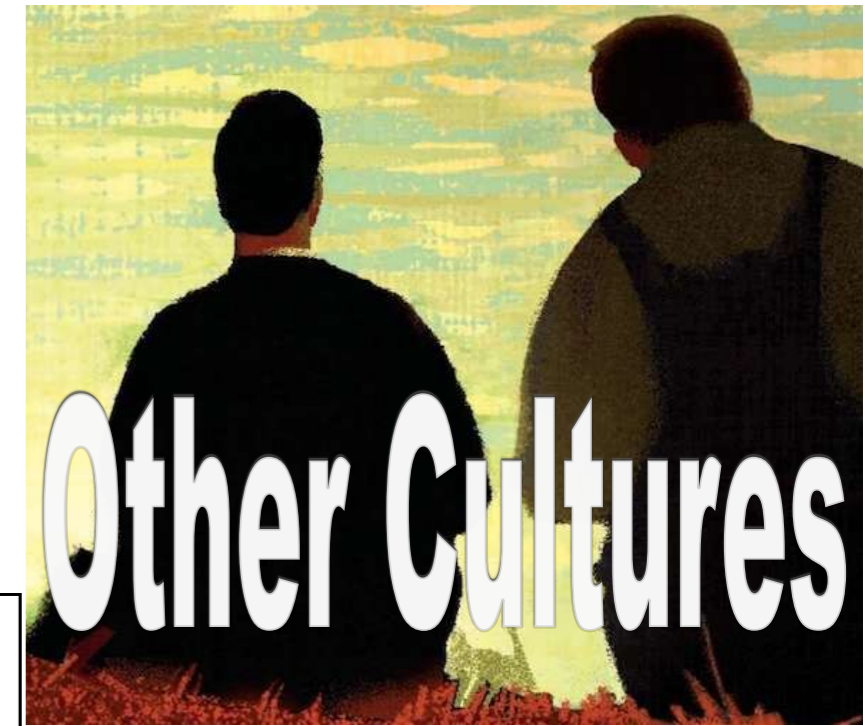
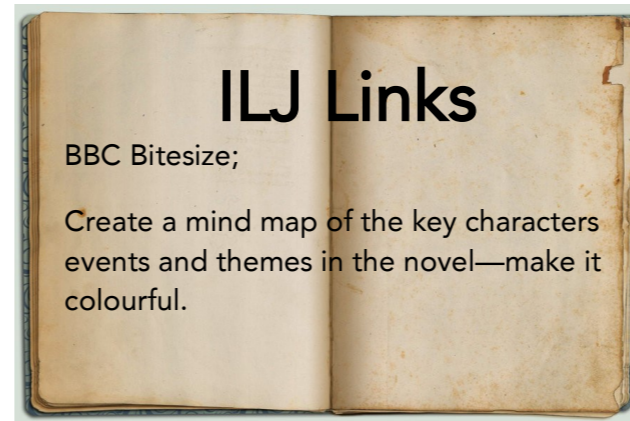




Year 9 Summer Term 2 – Knowledge Organiser ‘Other Cultures’
