What does the course involve?

The department follows the AQA Geography A Level specification.

During Year 12, you will learn the physical geography topics and options. These include the water and carbon cycles, coastal systems and landscapes and tectonic and atmospheric hazards. Fieldwork is completed in the Autumn Term of Year 13, with an individual investigation of between 3,000-4,000 words completed and submitted to the examination board.

During Year 13, the human geography topics and options will be studied. These include global systems and governance, changing urban places and population and the environment.

What can the qualification lead to?

The many skills in the course make geographers very attractive to employers. Geography's synthesis of facts, figures, ideas and perspectives provides ideal preparation for decision-making at work. Geography can lead to the study of many related subjects such as Architecture, Environmental Research, Planning, Geology and of course Geography.

A grade 6 in GCSE Geography.
